The Albert County Health & Wellness Centre (ACHWC) is based in Riverside-Albert but its services are available throughout rural Albert County. The family doctors and nurse practitioner at the clinic continue to accept new patients. To make an appointment or learn about the services, call **882-3100**.

The ACHWC Community Advisory Committee will work with the Health Centre and community partners to move forward with offering additional outreach services to the residents of Hillsborough and surrounding area.

ABOITEAUX IN ALBERT COUNTY: LANDSCAPE LUMPS

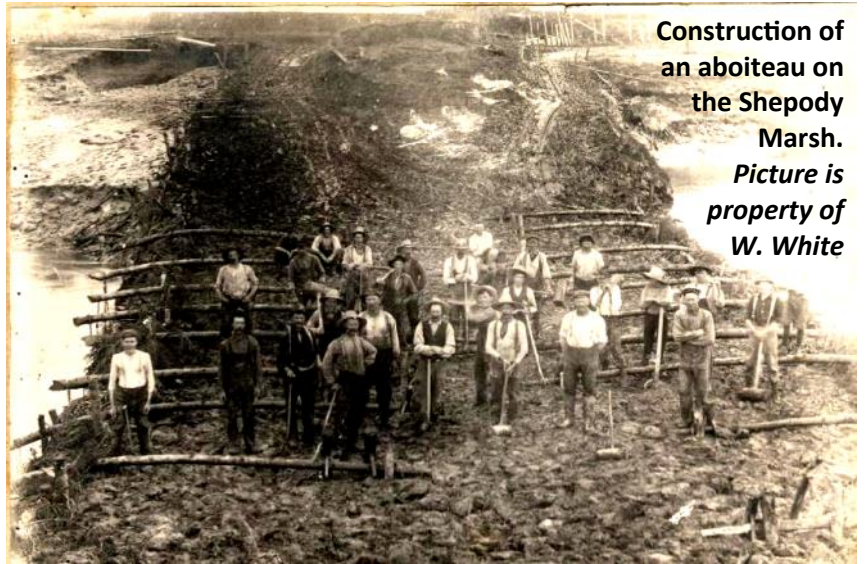
Aboiteaux refers to the dyke-and-sluice-gate system, the remains of which you can see on the marshland along the coast in Albert County. Today, you see rich marsh land with ridges (the remains of the dykes) spaced out at regular intervals. The building of the aboiteaux goes back to the Acadians, who built this water management system in the late 1600s to early 1700s.

The powerful tides in the Bay of Fundy gave rise to the development of the dykes and aboiteaux. Now, there is a dam to regulate the tides. Before the dam was built, the tides would flood back. As the tides ebbed and flowed, sediments, rich in organic matter and minerals, were deposited and created marshes. If the tides could be used, and the water desalinated, the area would have rich soil for farming.

The dykes were built higher than the tide level. A sluice box was a hollowed-out log, placed at the bottom of the dyke. At the end of the log were gates or clapper valves. This allowed fresh water to run out of the marsh at low tide. As the tide

rose, the gate would close, preventing the salt water from coming in to the marsh. In this way, the surface salt gets washed away from the soil.

DID YOU KNOW?

Grindstone Island can be seen if you look out into the Bay from Hopewell Hill, Mary's Point, Harvey, New Horton and surrounding areas. The island once housed several buildings, including a working lighthouse, the light keeper's residence and a wharf. The island also had a quarry which produced fine quality stone. The fog horn was powered by two engines that operated on kerosene oil.

The lighthouse tower, 93 feet above high water, was established in 1854. The light assembly was removed and taken to Saint John in 1985.

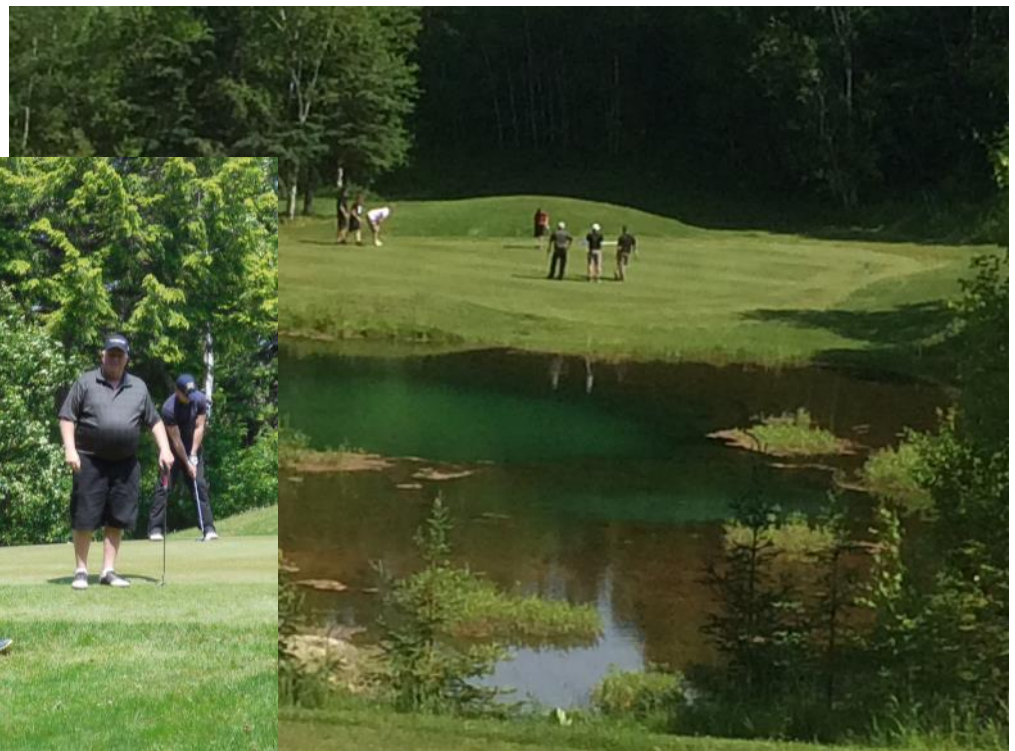

PARTNERSHIPS AND GARDENS BLOSSOM IN RIVERSIDE-ALBERT

Community partnership is evident at Forest Dale Home in the community of Riverside-Albert with the non-profit organization Foods of the Fundy Valley.

Monthly, the Community Food Smart "bulk-purchasing produce club" meets at Forest Dale Home to pack bags of fresh fruits and vegetables. The club works to improve food security to the citizens of the Alma, Riverside-Albert, Curryville, Lower Cape, New Horton and Harvey communities, who do not have access to a grocery store. The packing is done by volunteers from the

various communities served, as well as some of the residents living at Forest Dale Home. Many hands make light work! This service provides fresh food to people of all socio-economic levels. Forest Dale is happy to partner, providing a room and the opportunity to share the home with the local community; it is a great social time for everyone.

This spring, Foods of the Fundy Valley and the Shepody Food Bank led the building of the Riverside Community Garden. This project is largely supported by generous grants Shepody Food Bank received

from Food Banks Canada, Community Food Action Grant and the Compass Group. Forest Dale Home, one of the main partners, provided the land and water for the garden, along with much other support. The garden plots are used by local citizens, residents' families, staff and the Shepody Food Bank. Foods of the Fundy Valley with volunteers from the United Way Day of Caring helped establish perennial flower beds, a large rhubarb patch, raised strawberry gardens with easy access for those in wheelchairs and a cucumber trellis which provides shelter from the sun for the seniors. Four groups partnered to provide service.

The Foods of the Fundy Valley regularly hosts educational sessions for its members and the general public at Forest Dale Home. Residents enjoy attending the sessions and sharing their knowledge from past experiences. This partnership ensures their experience is retained and shared with the younger generations.

At Shepody River Days in Riverside-Albert in July, competition was strong at the kayak races. In the end, the Broadleaf Broncos won the 5th annual Shepody River Days kayak races.
