The Albert County Museum was bustling with activities on Saturday, May 13, as students from Anglophone East participated in the District's 2023 Regional Heritage Fair at the museum – the perfect location for a heritage fair celebration!

The Heritage Fairs program is a provincial initiative that takes place in schools for Grades 5 to 9. Students choose a New Brunswick or Canadian Heritage topic or theme of interest to them, research the topic and then create a heritage project. Each district school that participates has students attend the Regional Heritage Fair to present their projects to be judged for various awards. At the Awards Ceremony, students are presented with Regional Heritage Fair trophies and plaques, awarded to student projects in specific categories. Every student receives a 2023 Regional Heritage Fair medal and certificate, as well as books and special prizes.

At the Regional Heritage Fair students not only presented their projects to be judged, but also enjoyed enrichment activities throughout the day, as well as a guided tour of the Museum buildings and exhibits. During the outdoor enrichment activity with Dan Sinclair, a Fundy National Park interpreter, the students were motivated to connect with nature in their surroundings while they used binoculars and magnifying glasses to observe birds, plants and smaller living things. It was also a fun experience to set up tents on the Museum grounds.

Well known local artist, Tim Isaac, provided a unique artistic opportunity for the students to work together combining Bay of Fundy stones, sea shells and handmade clay tiles to create a "Nautical Mosaic". Each student designed their personal section of the mosaic. Notice the interior design of black clay tiles that formed the anchor inside the ship's wheel. The mosaic will be a wonderful display at the Albert County Museum!



Royal Canadian Legion Branch No. 32 – Hillsborough Remembrance Day Service 2023

Remembrance Day (also known as Poppy Day owing to the tradition of wearing a remembrance poppy) is a memorial day observed in Commonwealth member states since the end of the First World War in 1919 to honor those who paid the supreme sacrifice in the line of duty. The day is also marked by war remembrances in several other non-Commonwealth countries. In Canada, Remembrance Dav is observed on November 11 to recall the end of First World War hostilities, which formally ended "at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month" of 1918, in accordance with the armistice signed by representatives of Germany and the Entente between 5:12 and 5:20 that morning. ("At the 11th hour" refers to the passing of the 11th hour, or 11:00 am.) The First World War officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles on June 28, 1919.

Lt. Governor of New Brunswick Unveils Heritage Exhibit

On May 27, 2023, the Albert County Historical Society was honoured to have the Lt. Governor of New Brunswick, The Honourable Brenda Murphy, unveil a new heritage exhibit in tribute to The Honourable Abner Reid McClelan of Albert County, former Lt. Governor of New Brunswick, 1896-1902.

The McClelan exhibit includes a bilingual interpretive panel and a customized shadow box that displays the formal tuxedo worn by McClelan during his years as Senator and as the Lt. Governor of New Brunswick. The McClelan exhibit project was made possible through the support of the New Brunswick Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture. The tuxedo had been worn by Mr. James West, well known historian and great nephew of McClelan, at commemorative heritage celebrations, including the reenactment of the 1905 Opening of the Riverside Consolidated School, and at "Anna's Tea Party" held in 2009 at Victoria Manor, the McClelan's stately residence built in 1893.

Appreciative thanks to Beulah Morrissey of Riverside-Albert, a passionate promoter of community history, for donating McClelan's heritage tuxedo, now accessioned as a treasured artefact in the Albert County Museum collections. The impressive shadow box and professional mounting of the tuxedo display was the talented conservator work of Michelle Harvey-Larson, Studio on the Marsh. The tuxedo shirt and collar was recreated by Janet Hoar, local talented seamstress. The

bow tie, donated by ACHS Director, Sharon McIntyre, had belonged to her father, a long time County resident.

The Honourable Abner Reid McClelan (1831-1917), born in Riverside, Albert County, was a respected political figure, prominent businessman and significant benefactor to the community. Educated at the Wesleyan Academy (now Mount Allison University), McClelan, as a young man, showed a keen interest in business, as well as politics. In 1854, at age 23, he was elected to the NB Legislative Assembly and was MP for Albert County until Confederation in 1867, when he was appointed to the Senate of Canada. After serving as Senator for 29 years, he was appointed as New Brunswick's 10th Lt. Governor, a position he held from 1896–1902. Retiring from public life, McClelan returned to Victoria Manor in Riverside, where he and wife, Anna, enjoyed an active and social community life. McClelan turned his attention to local affairs, using his influence and personal wealth to bring improvements to his home community. With a deep interest in education, McClelan contributed \$5,000 towards the building of the Riverside Consolidated School in 1905. Following his death, the majority of his wealth was bequeathed to educational and benevolent projects, which resulted in the building of the McClelan Memorial Hospital in Riverside.

Enjoy a visit to the Museum and view "The Honourable McClelan Exhibit", which is now a permanent display!



What Is It?

Dolly Parton's *Imagination Library* is a 60-volume set of books beginning with the children's classic *The Little Engine That Could* \mathbb{M} .

Each month a carefully selected book will be mailed in your child's name directly to your home. Each and every book is a <u>FREE GIFT!</u> There is no cost or obligation to your family.

The Imagination Library was founded by Dolly Parton in 1996 in her home state of Tennessee. She wanted every preschool child to have their own library of books, knowing that early literacy is one of the most effective ways to improve the educational opportunities for children in any community. Books are chosen carefully in keeping with the following fundamental themes: love of reading and learning; regard for diversity of people, their roles, culture, and environment; promotion of self-esteem and confidence; and the appreciation of art and aesthetics.

Who Is Eligible?

Any child from birth to age 5 who is a resident in the catchment areas of: Riverside Consolidated School or Hillsborough Elementary School

What Are My Responsibilities?

- 1. Be a legal resident of the school catchment area.
- 2. Parent or Guardian submits registration online (to be approved by the Anglophone East School District).
- 3. Books are mailed only to the address listed on the official registration form. Your child will begin to receive books 8-10 weeks after your registration form has been received and will continue until your child's fifth birthday.
- 4. Read with your child, and enjoy books together every day!

How do I register my child?

In the event of a Change of Address:Login into your account and enter your new address for approval by ASD-E. Your child may continue to receive books as long as he/she resides in one of the designated catchment areas.


