

# More Parking for Alma's Fishing Boats

Wonder why there's a crane on the Alma Waterfront? The wharf is being upgraded – that's good news for the fishing community.

Vessel parking in the Alma harbour has been at 150% capacity for many years. This has been a serious safety concern, not to mention an inconvenience to the captains and crews. Overcrowding has resulted in damage to various vessels over the years.

In 2015, Small Craft Harbours announced that it had finally secured funding for the Alma Wharf Project. More than 3-million dollars is being used to create an extension that will provide additional parking spaces for five to seven vessels.

The first phase of the project was completed over the winter with the extension of the existing breakwater by approximately 120 feet. This will help protect the existing wharf and new wharf extension.

#### **ALBERT COUNTY WELCOMES REFUGEES**

In rural Albert County, we are familiar with the trend of people leaving. Teenagers leave the country for the city. People go West for jobs. The population keeps dwindling and, as a result, schools, stores and service centres close down.

There is hope that this pattern of migration may reverse. People are moving into rural Albert County, and the latest arrivals are receiving a warm welcome.

A family of Syrian refugees arrived in late June. The parents and their four children came from Aleppo. Before the civil war started, Aleppo was the largest city in Syria with more than two million inhabitants. Now, parts of the city are just rubble – the result of intense fighting in the region. The family

left the war-torn city and managed to travel to Turkey, where they lived in refugee camps until flying to Moncton.

The family will live in an apartment in Hillsborough and the children (ages 7, 9, 12 and 16) will attend school in Hillsborough. The family speaks Arabic; learning English will be one of their first challenges. As a community, we can all help ease their transition and ensure the family feels welcome.

A team of volunteers have helped set up a new home, however more volunteers are still needed to help offer transportation, help with language issues and we don't yet know what other help is need. If you are interested in helping, contact John Whitmore at whitmore@nb.sympatico.ca.


# **TELE-DRIVE ALBERT COUNTY**

# FOLLOW THE GOOSE BUTT, CAMELIA AIRHEART!

Por the three authors of Chocolate River Publishing's newest children's book, 'Follow the Goose Butt, Camelia Airheart!' it all began with getting lost.

En route to a writer's workshop, Beth Weatherbee, Colleen Landry and Odette Barr discussed writing a children's book together. As Colleen states, "We wanted it to be about an iconic Canadian animal and we decided it would be funny to write about a goose with no sense of direction. By the end of the trip, we had an idea for the book and we decided the goose would be named 'Camelia Airheart', after Amelia Earhart due to her love of flight."

Camelia has a faulty GPS (Goose Positioning System) and gets into trouble keeping in line with the rest of the flock. She is easily distracted in a delightful way and her journey takes her to meet a humpback whale in the Bay of Fundy, a herring gull on Grand Manan, a sandpiper flock at Hopewell Rocks, a lobster on the Acadian Peninsula, a chickadee and a moose at Mount Carleton, a deer near the Hartland Covered Bridge and a beaver near Mac-

taquac. During each part of her journey Camelia captivates the reader with her engaging language and simple desire to find her way home to her flock.

Each author brings her own talents to the book. Odette Barr's background as a former interpreter in Fundy National Park provided a foundation for the scientific knowledge in the book, as well as her beautiful illustrations.


Beth Weatherbee's musical talent inspired the creation of a song and Colleen Landry, known for her humorous blog and published articles, provided a comical air.
